

The students use their bodies to do actions for each letter of the alphabet, sing songs about letter to embed the sounds, manipulate materials to support letter formation and focus on visuals to embed letter recognition.

Don't wait—time is running out and if we cannot billet all of the visiting students the Exchange may be jeopardised.


Hosting can be a very rewarding experience and the Exchange cannot run without your help.



There are a lot of young people out there who feel isolated from their peers, experience social anxieties, find it hard to meet new people, or are just looking for something fun to do.


The Youth Chill Zone aims to provide a safe, welcoming, relaxing space for young people to meet new people and try new things.

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




