5. Reporting of student concerns


Student Wellbeing Leaders



P.A.R.T.Y Program at Lyell McEwin Hospital

On Wednesday the 15th of November, 10 students from Wiltja A<u>n</u>angu Secondary College and Avenues College took part in the "Prevent Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth" (P.A.R.T.Y.) Program at Lyle McEwan Hospital. Students heard information and real life stories from doctors, nurses and paramedics about the serious injuries that young people suffer by taking part in risky behaviours. The medical professionals explained issues around alcohol, drugs, speeding and not wearing protective items such as seat belts and helmets. Students learnt that 4 out of 10 deaths in young people are because of trauma that could have been avoided.

There were also a range of interactive opportunities for students; they followed a model patient on his journey from the ambulance to the intensive care unit and assisted doctors and nurses to perform CPR and support breathing, while learning about all of the machines and processes that have to happen to keep the patient alive. Students also learnt about the rehabilitation process that is required for patients who suffer physical trauma. Students had a go at feeding each other jelly water and mushy meals that some patients need to eat during their rehabilitation. Students had fun using the simulation goggles to see how difficult simple tasks, such as walking, throwing and catching a ball, were under the influence of alcohol and other drugs.

The P.A.R.T.Y. program was a relevant and engaging learning experience for students. We are very thankful to all of the doctors and nurses who volunteer their time to make this program possible.


