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Dear Parents and Caregivers

Last week was Reconciliation Week. This year's theme was 'Don't keep history a mystery'. Our students participated in a variety of learning opportunities, activities and events, which included a trip to McKay Avenue to participate in Avenues College's first B-12 Assembly. Our 6/7 choir performed Niina Waathangku beautifully; they have never sounded better! The 2/3 class presented an enacted version of 'Tiddalick the Frog', a Dreaming story that teaches about greed and the benefits of laughter. The high-quality reading and presentation has been recognised throughout the College with much praise being given by our senior students at McKay in the lessons that followed. The students also received messages about Reconciliation from our senior Student Voice and were an excellent audience for our Indigenous musician, Elisha. The Assembly was well-attended by community members making it a celebration of 'coming together' in many different ways.

Back at Beatty Avenue we were visited by Aunty Stephanie who shared Dreaming stories and bead making with the students. You will see some of their jewellery making skills in the accompanying photo!

With Ms Guinan, the students were able to write Reconciliation messages in footprints to represent the path we are all walking together. It's always inspiring and refreshing to see how embracing and inclusive our youngest citizens are – they are an excellent reminder of the opportunities we have and enjoy in our wonderful nation. Ms Sonja explored the weather from an Indigenous perspective with students learning that indigenous people used their senses: sight, hearing, smell and touch to determine the seasons. They also learned that the names of the seasons came from associated words, for example, the Kurna name for Summer, Warliti means heat and warmth and Kudila (winter) means to wash the earth. Students had an opportunity to try their artistic skills working with Miss Ashton and Ms Renu using Aboriginal symbols to decorate their boomerangs. There was also great enjoyment as they tried them out on the turf after school!



I would very much like to thank Lisa Rigney, the Homework Club and the parents and caregivers who helped to decorate our foyer and support us on the day in a variety of ways – your time, effort and willingness to be engaged in our learning and events is appreciated.

Year 4/5 - Visual Art and Maths

Masks have been worn in nearly all cultures, for various reasons, since the Stone Age. Masks have been worn as a form of disguise, by an actor in a performance, as part of a religious ceremony, as part of membership in a secret society, as punishment for a criminal or in celebration of a holiday.



The year 4/5 class have been combining their maths knowledge of symmetry with their artistic skills in order to design decorative masks. We discussed the various reasons why masks are worn and looked at examples from around the world. The children then used this information to create their own masks. 
We offer a warm, safe and friendly environment for children to relax and enjoy a variety of activities including games, art and craft, cooking, physical play, and time for homework if required.
